Unit Objective

This unit is open to undergraduate and postgraduate students. It equips the student to understand how the practice of mission has evolved throughout the centuries in response to the changing needs of the world. It introduces students to contemporary theological perspectives and entry points for mission.

Learning Outcomes

- Explain the biblical and theological basis of selected historical approaches to the task of world mission;
- 2. Analyse specific theological concepts that underpin the practice of mission;
- Critique from a theological and biblical perspective selected models of mission and their influence on Church ministry practice;
- Reflect upon and assess the key understandings of mission in selected contemporary Church documents and practice;
- 5. Apply a specific model of mission to the student's own ministry context.
